This risk assessment

The risk assessment has been produced as an overview corporate level risk assessment, based on current Government and CLC guidance. This should be used as a starting point to assist in the day-to-day management of specific sites and be supplemented by site-specific Covid risk assessments (including head and satellite office assessments). This risk assessment will be reviewed on a regular basis by the Senior Management team at PMC, specifically when any changes to the above published guidance are issued. Further advice will be sought from MSAFE Risk Management who will also be available to assist with site-specific risk assessments and site-level queries as required. All persons working in the office / on sites are to be briefed on the contents of this risk assessment to ensure they understand how to follow the control measures as outlined below. Operatives working for Subcontractors must also work in conjunction with their employers Covid risk assessments, and follow safe working systems when on site, not only to ensure that they are able to follow Covid control measures, but also to ensure tasks can remain to be carried out safely whilst observing the same.

Guidance and training

Persons working on site will be required to undergo formal Covid training / briefings / toolbox talks.
